

Down on the Farm with Reception

This term's learning 'Down on the Farm 'began when we discovered an egg in a nest. The children were so excited to find out whom the egg might belong to. We quickly realised that we did not know much about animals that lay eggs so we decided to become eggs-perts!

We began our Learning Journey by researching information in nonfiction books and we discovered that Oviparous animals lay eggs. We worked in small groups to produce posters, sorted animals by criteria and wrote individual stories about our own eggs and creatures that would hatch from them. We used eggs to count with, doubling, subitising, and even problem solving.

We organised Middle Farm to bring an incubation package and embarked on hatching our own hen eggs. We decided to write egg diaries as we waited then watched our chicks grow. The children were brilliant at looking after the chicks, feeding them, cleaning them, exercising them, and even holding them.

Year One London Wow Day

To launch our new topic, all about London, Year 1 jumped on a virtual tour bus to explore the landmarks of London. The children arrived at each learning station to explore, create and discover interesting facts about London. The children looked at the shape and structure of the landmarks and constructed the skyline out of Lego.

The children also got creative with designing the King's head on a postage stamp, created a crown fit for the king and made a homemade, string bunting of flags to decorate our classrooms. We had a great WOW day!

All year groups have enjoyed their Beach School visits this half-term in the sunshine! Lots of fun learning has taken place which links to their year group curriculum subjects.




