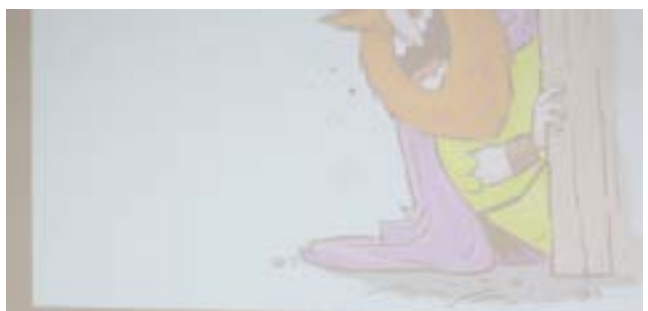
Reading Celebration & Adam Stower Visit

Maths in Reception

The Reception children have really enjoyed exploring activities inspired by the book 'What the Ladybird Heard' by Julia Donaldson. The children have learned to double numbers and record number stories by creating their own number bond ladybirds. Year 1 Bread Making with Chef Rob

As part of our topic about the Great Fire of London, Year 1 stepped back in time to 1666 and arrived at Pudding Lane - Windlesham Hall.

The children met Chef Rob and followed instructions to add the correct ingredients to make a sticky dough. The children added a little flour and learnt how to mix the dough, let it rest then stretch it, fold it and knead it. Chef Rob then explained the dough needed to sit in a warm oven to rise. After that the children were each given their own ball of dough to knead again and fold into neat little bun shapes. Poppy seeds, cheese and flour were sprinkled on top and our creations looked wonderful.

Chef Rob baked our bread, the smell was fabulous. The children reminded Chef Rob to be very careful when turning the oven completely off as we did not want a Great Fire of Windlesham starting in the kitchens!

Paddington Bear Adventures in Year 2

Maths in Year 3

Year 3 have had lots of fun and challenging topics in maths this half term. They have thoroughly enjoyed learning about fractions, time and in particular money.

We started our week on money with an introduction, where we talked about the different coins, notes and their values. We then learnt how to add money in pence and pounds. We used the expanded column method to add together money learning about the decimal point and when to use it. We also learnt about how we can pay for items in a shop with more money than their value and receive change. We practised all of our new learning with word problems and during our Friday Maths lesson when we had a go of role-playing shop keepers and customers.

The children really enjoyed embedding their learning through the opportunities to seriously act out their roles! It was engaging and challenging to work out how much customers owed when they brought several items and also how much change they were due when they used notes to pay.

Poetry in Year 4

This half term, Year 4 has immersed themselves in the world of poetry from different cultures, exploring a variety of poetic forms and styles. The students began by studying Haiku, a traditional Japanese form of poetry. Next, the pupils explored Tanka poems, another form of Japanese poetry. Tanka poems extend the Haiku structure with two additional lines, following a 5-7-5-7-7 syllabic pattern. Here's a delightful example by Dorothy and Delilah:

My Sandwich

I like bread and cheese
With mustard, ham and butter
Then I got angry
And I dropped it I the sand
Now I am Devastated

Limericks, known for their humorous and whimsical nature, were another form the pupils enjoyed. These five-line poems follow an aabba rhyme scheme. Here's a playful limerick by Alex:

There once was an old hairy wizard,
Who was stuck in a terrible blizzard,
He tried to run fast,
But he ran straight past,
His small pet giggling lizard.

Year 4 has shown remarkable creativity and enthusiasm in exploring these diverse poetic forms, making this half term a truly enriching experience!

Year 6 present 'Olivia'

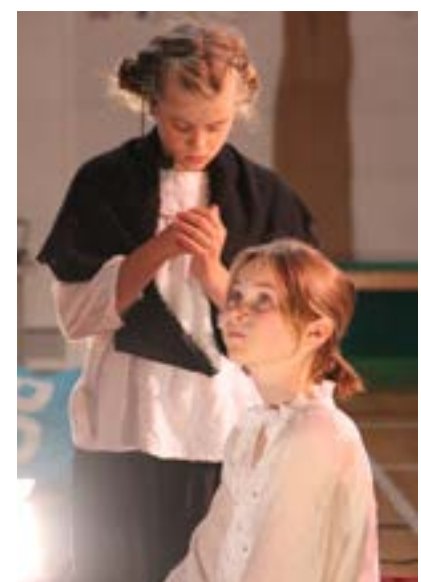
On the 4th July, Year 6 performed 'Olivia' the Musical, supported by the Year 5 chorus.

Softball Cricket at Sompting Abbots

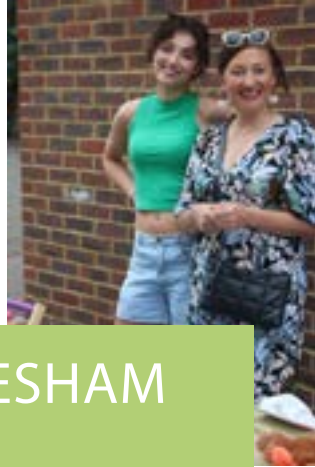

Consider walking part of the way to school or share the school run with other parents

... meaning fewer cars at the school entrance

... making it safer for you and your children.



If you need to drive your child to school

For the safety of your child, their friends, and the local community we request that you park safely, legally and considerately. This means not parking on single or double yellow lines, not double parking, not stopping or dropping off on the School Keep Clear yellow zig-zag or pedestrian crossing, white zig-zag lines, not parking on corners or junctions near the school entrance, not blocking driveways.

What can I do instead?

Try 'Park and Stride' - park away from the school entrance and walk the last 5 or 10 minutes. Walking half a mile only takes between 8 and 17 minutes. How many calories you burn depends on how fast you walk!

Try a 'Walking Bus' - organise a small group of parents to share the walk to school and take it in turns with other parents to do the school run. We could even combine this idea with Park and Stride.

Walking to school contributes to the recommended daily physical activity for you and your children. It also helps to reduce congestion around the school and helps to improve air quality, providing benefits for everyone.

Try Car Sharing - if you have to drive to school then get together with other parents who need to go by car and take it in turns to drive. **You could start by doing any of these just once or twice a week.**

Share the roads, share the responsibility
