Anti-Bullying Week - Creating a Culture of Kindness at Windlesham Primary School

Windlesham Primary School embraced Anti-Bullying Week with an exciting focus on kindness and celebrating individuality. Spreading Kindness Across the School

PSHE in Year 6

Year 6's focus in PSHE this term has been all about rights and responsibilities. They started by learning about the UN Charter of Children's Rights. In groups, they explored how the different articles could be separated into three main categories- Basic Needs, Safe From Harm. Express Themselves.

The theme continued during Black History month, where we learned about Ruby Bridges and how hard her family fought for her to have the right to an equal education without being segregated. In Anti-Bullying week we looked at how we can be responsible for helping to solve conflicts respectfully.

Our unit of learning ended with discussing legal rights. As a class, Year 6 debated several different topics, such as being allowed to vote at 18, drive a car at 17 and marry at 18. Throughout the debate, the children shared different viewpoints and shared their reasoning clearly, demonstrating the Windlesham values of Good Listening and Respect. To finish, they selected one legal right and wrote a persuasive argument, explaining the reasons behind their point of view.
