Preparing children for life



English

- RWI: consolidate and progress through Set 2 and 3 sounds
- Continue to develop handwriting skills: letter size/formation and introduce cursive
- Spelling: consolidate knowledge of high frequency words; common exception words; exploring alternative vowel phonemes
- Sentence level skills including conjunctions and adjectives
- Reading and writing across a range of genres such as instructions, adventure stories, traditional tales and poetry

Mathematics

- Addition and subtraction of one-digit numbers to 20 and beyond
- Missing number problems
- Recognise and find half and a quarter of a shape and number
- One-step word problems involving addition and subtraction
- Compare and measure length and mass
- Tell the time using o'clock and half past
- Recognise and name common 3D shapes
- Counting in steps of 2, 5 and 10

Science

- Identifying plants
- Naming parts of a plant and tree
- Know what plants need to grow
- Life cycle of a plant
- Investigating how to grow a bean or seed
- Visits to the school garden
- Seasonal changes

Computing

- Continuing to develop keyboard skills
- E-safety – staying safe online
- Data Handling – using pictograms
- Creating algorithms – Using Maze Explorers and Lego Explorers

Art and Design

- Andy Warhol toy art – printing, painting and drawing
- Exploring toys from around the world using different media
- Making a toy from the past
- Explore the patterns on different animals

French

- Transport and The Circus.

Geography

- Looking at toys from different countries
- Identifying how lives in other countries differ from our own
- Expanding understanding of the world around us

Music

- Singing songs with actions and Winter/Spring songs
- Peter and the Wolf
- Learning the difference between the steady beat and the rhythm of the words using percussion
- Creative movement
- Exploring pitch on the glockenspiels

PSHE

- Health and medicines
- Litter and pollution
- Managing anger
- Internet safety
- Characteristics of healthy family life

History

- Looking at the similarities and differences between toys today and in the past
- Exploring the concepts of 'old' and 'new'

PE

- Swimming: improving stroke techniques and pool safety
- Developing understanding of games and implementing team work
- Development of throwing and catching, extending to striking actions
- Gymnastics: developing physical balance, agility and co-ordination

Religious Studies

- Teachings and stories from the New Testament
- The Easter Story
- Symbols found in a church and Christian home
- Celebrations and Baptism ceremonies

Philosophy lessons will take place approximately every 6 weeks.

Spring Theme is Biodiversity and Money.

Drama lessons take place weekly. This term's focus is on improvisation, devising and rehearsal.
